### CT 2-1-1 Hotline:

The 2-1-1 hotline is available for those seeking information or assistance regarding services available in the State of Connecticut. Dial 2-1-1 or 1-800-203-1234 and press option '5' (for Spanish, press option '7' and then '5') or visit [www.211ct.org](http://www.211ct.org). Bilingual specialists or interpreters are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year and the 211ct.org website can be translated into 30 different languages

### FEMA Housing Assistance:

- **Rental Assistance** –Rental assistance is available to give directly to disaster survivors, who are then responsible for finding available rental resources of their choosing. The amount of monthly rental assistance available to survivors depends upon the county or parish where the survivor has relocated following Hurricane Maria.
- **Home Repair/ Replacement**– Financial assistance to homeowners to repair uninsured home damage caused by the disaster. The assistance is intended to repair your home to a safe and sanitary or functioning condition.
- **Inspection Information** -- FEMA is allowing survivors to verbally designate a local point of contact or representative to act on their behalf, if they are unable to be present for an inspection. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will also accept a local representative in order to install a blue roof on a survivor's home. Sign up for the Blue Roof Program, or provide a right of entry form, by calling 888-766-3258.
